Ogilvie 2 has been busy creating wonderful snowmen decorations for our classroom door. To do this, we explored a wide range of processes and materials. Firstly, we created a variety of textured papers. We enjoyed tearing tissue paper and gluing this onto paper to create a collage. Next, we printed textured wallpaper and/ or bubble wrap. We particularly loved to hear the sound of the bubbles pop as we rolled our rollers over the bubble wrap!



After our papers were complete, we used our numeracy learning to help create our snowmen. We have been learning about shape and finding shapes all around us in the classroom. We used several objects from the class to draw around to create shapes for our snowmen. We also used a hole punch to make tiny circles, which were used for the snowman's eyes and mouth. We glued the shapes together and our snowmen were complete. Great work O2!




Spotlight on Ogilvie 1

It has been an exciting term in Ogilvie 1 with non-stop learning. Within our focus on 'tools for reading', students have the opportunity to choose stories and practice reading from left to right, as well as exploring sounds, letters and words. 'Functional writing' is developed through fine motor tasks, such as tracing and cutting our handprints to make a Christmas tree for our classroom door. In Maths, students have been developing their awareness of how money is used through our class shop and can recognise and use a range of coins. Every single day Ogilvie 1 know that friendship, caring, sharing, fairness, equality and love are important in building positive relationships.

During this term in Core, the young people in 3B have been working on PowerPoints for their Scotland Topic.

Each pupil has chosen a country and has researched various aspects in order to make comparisons with Scotland. At the end, everyone had the opportunity to present their PowerPoint in class and then take part in a short question and answer session.

You may have heard your child speaking about the game '*Among* Us'.

We decided to use this interest to engage the pupils in their maths work. They completed a coordinates activity to make the shape of the character. The pupils also spotted that the game uses pattern as well as directions so we are going to adapt our plans for next term to include these in our maths alongside the co-ordinate work that we have started.

We have used this time to improve pupils' fitness and explore the local community through walking and outdoor circuits.
